- Tent (2-4 man: keep in mind a 2 man tent will fit 2 adults with no gear) with ground cloth/tarp (Do not forget tent pegs/stakes and hammer)
- Bedding (Pillows and sleeping bag, sheets or blankets)
- Ground pad or Air Mattress (if desired) to cushion your back (no electricity at campsite for pump, battery powered pumps only)
- Flashlight/lantern with spare batteries
- Extra pair of clothing for the Season
- Hat
- Light Jacket if the temperature will get below 65
- Class A Uniform: Shirt, Belt, Neckerchief, slide (Lions should have the BSA Lion t-shirt) This will be worn
 at campfire on Saturday and worship service on Sunday morning
- Class B Uniform (Pack 359 T-shirt or other scout shirt if you have one)
- Closed toed shoes (no sandals or high heels, be prepared for hiking)
- Extra shoes (you can keep in vehicle)
- Water bottle
- Water the water at camp is potable but some prefer bottled water
- Charger block/cord for phone (once again, no electricity at campsites but there is electricity at the dining hall)
- Sunscreen
- Insect repellant
- Medication and small first aid kit (Only parents and Camp Medic are allowed to administer medications to cubs! If your cub has allergies or you think they have allergies bring children's Benadryl)
- Toiletries (toothbrush/paste, soap, comb, deodorant, etc.)
- Hand towel and wash clothes (showers may not be available)
- Camp Chair (if desired)
- Small ice chest for drinks (if desired)
- Snacks in bug and critter proof container (if desired) there is a camp store with snacks and drinks by the parking lot but it is not near the campsites
- Matches to light fire (in water-proof container)
- Hiking Stick (if desired)
- Small backpack to carry with you (if desired for water, charger block/cord for phone, papers, crafts etc)
- 4 wheeled wagon Not necessary, however <u>You will need to carry all your items from the parking lot to your campsite.</u> Many campers have found that using a 4 wheeled wagon or something on wheels that you can pull helps transport all your gear to your temporary home.
 - *** Campers are not allowed to drive your vehicle into the campsite area to unload. ***

Except for a tent, you should be able to find all the things you need for your first outing right from home. If you do not have a sleeping bag, you can bring a pillow and blankets. Keep in mind the temperature you will experience; you can use a light sleeping bag designed for summer use only and wrap it with a blanket or two to keep you warm. If liquid sunshine (rain) is possible, be sure to pack and keep your extra cloths in a plastic bag or container so they do not get wet.

Things not to bring:

Fuels, firearms, fire crackers, music box, alcohol Lastly, get ready for a fun adventure. You can do this!
